

We ask Circle Leaders to keep pushing for an eventual face-to-face meeting with your State Reps and Senators on the Drivers License for Immigrants issue -- asking that they press for a public hearing on the bills. Contacting them NOW keeps the issue and your request on their radar.

FROM THE CATHOLIC BISHOPS – IMMIGRATION POLICY AND COVID-19

"Given the extreme public health concerns related to COVID-19 and the heightened vulnerability of immigrants at this time, we wanted to update you on this important issue. Regarding these important issues we have been and will continue to engage Congress and the Trump Administration to ensure that immigration-related protections are robust and that any information generated is widely disseminated.

1. Access to health care for all regardless of status.

2. Ending all enforcement around sensitive locations such as hospitals and clinics.

3. Suspension of the implementation of "Public Charge" during this time.

4. Regarding USCIS office closures, extension for certain Visa categories, including DACA renewals, given substantial impact office closures could pose."
